





ABOUT THE CAST

NORMAN ATHERTON:

This is her first appearance at the National Theatre but she is well known to Lavington audiences for her performances in "Chase Me Comrade" and "Cinderella". Rumour has it that during her schools days she became celebrated for playing romantic male leads.

CHRIS BIRKRY

A newcomer to Nairobi Theatre he became well known in Sheffield amateur theatrical circles where since 1971 he has taken a prominent part in no less than six plays and eight operas.

LORIS VALLES:

Started dancing at $2\frac{1}{2}$ and on stage at 3, Loris Valles has had a full and varied career in the world of music and the theatre. She formed her own cabaret act and toured the world before coming to Kenya. In 1972 she directed the choreography for "Salad Days" and has subsequent ly taken the part of Anita in "West Story" and understudied Dolly in "Hello Dolly".

BOB ROSE:

A member of the Uasin Gishu Arts Society, Eldoret, he has performed recently in "Royal Hunt of the Sun", "The Crucible" and Boeing-Boeing". Now based in Nairobi, Bob Rose has the singular distinction of being an ex-E.A. Motor-cycle Champion and still holds the record for Nakuru Part circuit.

DAMIAN McKINNEY:

At the Banda School and just fourteen years old this is his debut on the Kenya stage, though he has appeared in school plays in England. Up to now he has been better known for his skills on the cricket field.

CAROLYN McARDLE:

A student at Kenya High School and sixteen years old this is her first speaking part outside school productions. She played the part of a singing fairy in "The Dream".

RICHARD STARNES:

He arrived in Nairobi from Zambia only one week before this show went into rehearsal. He has played leading roles in Lusaka in "Conduct Unbecoming", "Antigone", "Journey's End" and "Oliver" and also did a lot of work back stage.

ANNETTE HENDRY:

This is also her first appearance on the Nairobi stage. She has always been interested in the theatre and taught English and Drama after graduating from London University.

JOHN ANDERSON:

When not pursuing the art of epidemiological virology John Anderson is at his happiest crouched over his guitar at a Normandie Hootenanny. He is making his debut as an actor in this play. A semi-professional singer in Britain his first experience of theatre was backstage to "Fiddler on the Roof". Since then he has appeared in "Kismet" and was Assistant Musical Director in "The Dream"

ANGELA MORRELL:

Another newcomer to the National Theatre making a return to the stage after a break of more than five years. Angela has performed various roles ranging from the cat in "Dick Whittington", the principal boy in "Mother Goose" and a 70 years old woman in "The Ghost Train".

DAVID CARRIER:

Had little to do with the theatre before coming to Kenya in June 1970. Since then he has played in four Lavington pantomimes one Music Hall, and has yet to live down being cast as Petrovyan in "Chase Me Comrade". This is his first appearance at the National Theatre.



THE DIRECTOR

JAMES FALKLAND was born and brought up in the West of Scotland and gained his first experience of theatre in school, unversity and local amateur productions. During National Service with the Royal Air Force he did a considerable amount of drama work with the British Council in Berlin, then gained a two year scholarship to the London Academy of Music and Dramatic Art.

His professional experience includes repertory in Derby, Farnham, Leicester, a year with the Royal Shakespeare Company, various production tours in the United Kingdom, radio, television and films.

Five years ago he emigrated to Malta where he not only produced for local amateur companies but also founded the first Maltse professional production company and was largely responsible for generating enthusiasm for Drama in the Royal University where he taught and produced in theatre techniques.



His travels then brought him to the Donovan Maule Theatre in Nairobi for twelve months as actor, director and lighting designer and only recently has formed his own business which he hopes will be able to help in the development of East African Theatre.

Among the many productions he has been involved in he has special affection for "SLEUTH" at the Donovan Maule, "HOTEL PARADISO" in Malta, "JULIUS CAESAR" at Stratford and "OTHELLO" at the Kenya National Theatre.

His theatrical activities leave him little time for hobbies — and, one feels, for his wife and two daughters — but he confesses that in his free time he reads widely and collects records.

NAIROBI CITY PLAYERS

In September 1956 an "acting group was formed to be known as the Nairobi City Players, and in its Constitution set down the following aims and objects:-111/

(a) Regularly to present theatrical productions of a good dramatic and artistic standard by utilising and co-ordinating the best available acting talent, producers set designers and technical stage

de me tuffiment of (a) above, to be unstinting in the cost of production, subject to the (b) Tow limi set le Standing Committee.

(c) To take all pressary steps to encourage the drama and to improve the facilities available for theatrical productions.

The City Players have adhered rigidly to these aims from their formation and since that time have presented at the National Theatre, Nairobi, a total of 67 productions including 17 full scale musicals (figures include the current production).




