

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LARRY OAKS

An Appreciation



The Pantomime this year is dedicated to the memory of Larry Oaks - director, choreographer, mentor and, above all, friend of Nairobi City Players. We were saddened to hear of his death in June this year. The world of theatre lost a talented and experienced "Jack-of-all-Trades".

Born in Jersey to a farming family, Larry set his sights on being a dancer. He achieved this, and from those early foot tapping years in theatre, television and cabaret, he went on to become choreographer for many stage and film productions. He then entered the field of direction and his great success associated him with many star names and smash hit musicals and took him to New York, Los Angeles, Toronto, Norway, Denmark, Holland and Israel as well as the United Kingdom.

But friends and colleagues throughout the world mourn the loss of a warm, generous-hearted man who loved life. He showed his own confidence in Kenyan talent when he returned time and time again. In all, he directed ten productions for Nairobi City Players. Tonight we remember him as we knew him.

His first production was "Fiddler on the Roof" in 1971 with Frank Price in the leading role, when his admiration for the hard-working and talented amateurs he worked with was born. He revived "Fiddler" bringing Barry Master to play Tevye in 1991 and between those years he directed "Kismet" (1971), "Hello Dolly" (1972), "Man of La Mancha" (1973), "Side by Side by Sondheim" (1980), "Annie" and "Jack and the Beanstalk" (1986), "Dick Whittington" (1992). "Cinderella" in 1993 was his last production in Kenya.

In a typically courageous and generous gesture, knowing that his life was to be shortened by cancer, he returned to Kenya in 1994 to throw a farewell party for his friends, as he did in many countries he had visited in his long career.

We miss his friendship. We will long remember his warmth, his wonderful smile and the high standards he sought and achieved in fine productions for NCP.

ROY LAWRENCE

It is with mixed feelings that Roy directs this pantomime, as it is due to the fact that Jon Tarlton was taken very ill just before flying out to Kenya. Roy had been looking forward to just playing the part of the Wolf, but has admirably stepped into the breach as Director as well. He wishes Jon a speedy recovery and hopes that he did as good a job as Jon would have done.

More about Roy. From an early age in Manchester, England, Roy took an interest in Theatre assisting back-stage and playing "bit" parts whenever possible. He came to East Africa as a young man where he worked in Kampala, Dar-es-Salaam and finally Nairobi. He has produced, choreographed and taken part in several successful productions including "Kiss Me Kate", "The Rivals", "Guys and Dolls". "A Funny Thing....", "Wait Until Dark" and "Man For All Seasons". His pantomimes include "Sinbad the Sailor", "Cinderella", "Aladdin", "Dick Whittington" and "Jack and the Beanstalk". The latter three he directed, and in each one had to step in to play one of the leading roles!!

Roy writes about the play...

"Little Red Riding Hood" based on the famous short fairy-tale is an entirely new pantomime for Nairobi City Players. The action takes place in and around the village of "Merrydown-Under-the-Wood". A peaceful little place - at least until a ravenous wolf arrives on the scene intent on satiating his hunger by stealing a lamb or two which are carefully tended by young Mary, the heroine of this tale. Mary is presented with a lovely white dress and splendid red hood and cape for her birthday by her Grandmother, who lives in a cottage within the nearby woods. The local constabulary comes out in force to hunt the wolf, who, after failing to snatch any of the lambs, plots to snare (with the help of some woodland jinis) "Miss Red Riding Hood" whilst she is visiting her Grandmother at her cottage.......



GEOFFREY NJOGU - Musical Director

Geoffrey joined Starehe Boy's Centre in 1989 where he began to study the piano and saxophone. During his four years of Secondary Education he achieved the Associated Board of Royal Schools of Music Grade 8 piano and Grade 5 saxophone. He also won first place in the 1992 Kenya Music Festival in the advanced piano solo class and the Kibuhosya Cup for woodwinds. In 1993 he won a British Council Scholarship to study music at the Chichester College of Arts, Science and Technology where he was highly commended. At 21 he is one of the youngest Musical Directors to work with Nairobi City Players, although as you can gather not the least talented. Geoffrey is currently a Student of Architecture at the University of Nairobi.

RICHARD PITT-KENNEDY Choreographer

Richard started his dancing career with Vera Zerkovitch here in Nairobi. From Kenya he moved to Elmhurst Ballet School under Mercia Hetherington for advanced Royal Academy Dancing and Solo Seal. He moved briefly to the Royal Ballet under Anthony Dowell and then to Ballet Rambert under Richard Alston and Robert North. After being injured on tour in Italy, Richard gave up commercial dancing and moved in to the Pub business and also opened an entertainment agency in London. He is at the moment in the process of selling his pub in England as he moved back to Kenya in March 1994 due to his mother's illness. Sadly she passed away at the end of September this year. Richard is a Director of MD Kampf Insurance Agents and has no plans to leave Kenya.





ADRIAN STRAIN - Grandma

Adrian is a new recruit to the Nairobi City Players although he has lived in Kenya for nearly 20 years. His acting career began 30 years ago in an amateur West End Company, where he met his wife. Since then, it has been interrupted by long periods of "resting" while he has had to pursue other interests, including his career as an economist. He prides himself as being the only "practical" member of his gifted family, as his wife is a musician, his son is an art historian and his daughter writes and produces plays.

CHARLENE PAMELA ELKINGTON - Red Riding Hood

Charlene goes to school at the Nairobi Academy where she is active in Drama, Sports, Ballet and Music. She has featured in several school productions including "Sound of Music" (as the Baroness), "The Nutcracker" and "Romeo and Juliet". She is also a professional model.

This is her first performance with Nairobi City Players and hopefully will not be her last.





GERALD IRUNGU - Police Inspector

Gerald is a bacteriologist at the Kenyatta National Hospital and has been for the last 14 years. He first acted with Nairobi City Players in "Toad of Toad Hall" and after a longish break was seen treading the boards for us last year in "Lifegame'94". His first appearance on stage was in "J.C. Superstar" in 1977 and since then has also been in "Joseph....." (1980), "Equus" and "The Wiz" (1984) at the Donavan Maule and the Phoenix. Gerald loves reading Si-Fi and collects Marvel Comic "X" titles. To keep fit he plays squash, soccer, table-tennis and lawn tennis, as well as being an avid runner with the Nairobi Hash House Harriers. He says his favourite past-time is cookery. In what little spare time he has left after all his other interests, Gerald also likes to do a little water colouring, sketching and calligraphy.



TONY KIMANI - Jason

Tony is 20 years old and works for a news gathering company as an adminstrator and loves the excitement and variety it offers.

He claims to have found the secret of long life and he is revealing it to us. That is song, dance and laughter - in one word Pantomime!!!





BIRGIT KRAUSE - Mum

We asked Birgit to write a short piece telling us a little bit of her life story, and why she was doing the pantomime. This is what she wrote....

"Oh goodness, Oh goodness what shall I say About myself and what's "behind me" - no way!

Pantos are big fun and crazy too, rehearsals are often like being in a zoo!!

That's why I join in for the third time, and trust you equally enjoy this pantomime"



JACQUI MASON - Fairy

Jacqui made her "stage" debut at the age of three, singing and dancing on a table top in a pub - The Winning Post - in Twickenham, England. She sang "You Are My Sunshine" to British and American servicemen home on leave from fighting in Europe. From that day music and drama have been part of her life. She has appeared in most American musicals, in cabaret, in Old Tyme Music Hall, in straight plays, in pantomime and sang tenor in her local choir for 26 years. She took a



break from the theatre in the sixties to have her five children but resumed when the oldest boy joined the school choir. This school choir became famous for its Christmas television broadcast of Carols on Christmas Eve. At one time Jacqui and her five children were all part of that choir as they were of the church choir. She met her husband, Robin, through music and he and his daughter were part of both church and school choirs. In Kenya she is again involved with music being chairman of the Nairobi Music Society and a committee member of Nairobi City Players. She says whether performing, doing administration or behind the scenes, it doesn't matter, she still gets that theatrical "buzz" on opening night.



LACY WARNER - Sammy

Lacy Warner, 11 years old, was born in Jacksonville, Florida. She has lived in Austria, Zimbabwe, Ireland, Mexico, America and now Kenya. Lacy is not a stranger to the stage having appeared in productions in California, Maryland and here. She has also appeared in an Educational Television show.

SIMON RIBEIRO OLIVER - Robbie

Simon, 11 years old, was born in Manila, Philippines. He is a Swiss/Portuguese and has lived with his parents in many different countries and came to Kenya in 1991. He speaks French, English and Portuguese. He is a 6th form student at Kenton College and is very good in sports being an accomplished swimmer and tennis player. He enjoys music and plays the recorder, piano, flute and guitar. For hobbies he lists theatre, jazz dance and singing. For 2 years he has been studying LAMDA and has passed both exams with distinction and honours. These skills he put to use in different school plays. This performance with Nairobi City Players is to broaden his experience by working with a larger number of people - and besides which Simon loves being on stage!

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

NAIROBI CITY PLAYERS

In 1956, John Ebdon, Donald Whittle (both ex-professional actors), the Late Noreen Antrobus and the late Bryan Epsom, all dedicated thespians, met and decided to form an "acting group" to be known as "The Nairobi City Players". The constitution of this new group was unusual for an amateur society as the main aims and objects were stated as follows:

- (a) Regularly to present theatrical productions of a good dramatic and artistic standard by utilising and coordinating the best available acting talent, directors, set designers and technical stage assistants in Kenya.
- (b) Towards the fulfilment of (a) above, to be unstinting in the cost of productions, subject to the budget limits of the standing committee.
- (c) To take all necessary steps to encourage drama and to improve the facilities available for theatrical productions.

The City Players, despite vastly changed circumstances affecting the theatre in Kenya since their inception, have adhered faithfully to these aims and they have presented over 120 productions, including many fullscale musicals, mostly at the Kenya National Theatre.

Over the years many talented people have made major contributions to the work of the group, working in all fields of theatrical enterprise. Their remarkable endeavours have resulted in a high standard of production of which this group is understandably proud.


